A Guide for Daily Family Prayer For the Week of September 16th to 22nd

Catechesis Notes for the Week...

What happens on Sunday mornings sets the tone and pace for the whole week of a Christian. In fact, what happens on Sunday morning, or, as the 3rd commandment states, whenever the Sabbath is remembered and observed, is the most important thing in our whole life. Can you believe it? The most important thing in the whole world is so simple, so ordinary, so regular—and yet, God comes to you in Christ, forgives your sin, and sets you right with God forever. Our confessions say it this way:

"So the worship and Divine Service of the Gospel is to receive gifts from God. On the contrary, the worship of the Law is to offer and present our gifts to God. However, we can offer nothing to God unless we have first been reconciled and born again. This passage, too, brings the greatest comfort, as the chief worship of the Gospel is to desire to receive the forgiveness of sins, grace, and righteousness" (*Apology of the Augsburg Confession*, V.130:189).

It's for this reason, receiving these Gospel gifts from our Lord, that we gather together at Church. Together we hear His Word, receive the promise of sins forgiven, and eat and drink the body and blood of our dear Lord for our forgiveness and life. Our daily lives receive their ordering and peace from this altar and this pulpit, in this Church where Christ has promised to be for us.

Here we confess God as One. Here the Baptized gather around this oneness, and are joined together into this One Body. As St. Paul says,

"There is one body and one Spirit—just as you were called to the one hope that belongs to your call—one Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God and Father of all, who is over all and through all and in all." (Eph 4:4-6)

This one God comes to us each and every *Lord's Day* (Sunday) in order to unite us to Himself and Himself to us. Let us ever rejoice in such a gracious and giving Lord!
