Catechesis Notes for the Week...

It doesn't get more beautiful than what Nathan said to David in our *Learn-by-Heart Scripture* for this week. It's quite simple, direct, and to the point: "The Lord has put away your sin; you shall not die!"

You'd have to go back and read all of 2 Sam 11-12 for the context, but briefly this is what follows David's sin with Bathsheba. It follows David's deceit and lies and murder and adultery and coveting and stealing. In a word, it follows David's *sin*. But even with all this sin, David thought he got off the hook—no one knew!

No one, of course, but the Lord. And the Lord has a man, a prophet, who goes as the Lord's mouthpiece. Whatever the Lord says the prophet says. Nathan is the Lord's man. He shows David his sin (LAW). David recognizes his sin, which is first and foremost a sin against God Himself. Then David confesses his sin—that's the first part of our Scripture this week: "I have sinned against the Lord." With such a confession we know the LAW has done its work—it has killed David's self-trust and stripped him of any hope within him.

Then comes the other word (GOSPEL), which forgives David and delivers the work of Christ for him. That's the Absolution (that is, forgiveness). In this case it has come from the called minister of Christ (Nathan) and is just as valid and certain, even in heaven, as if Christ our dear Lord dealt with David Himself.

It's hard to find a better example of such a pure confession of sin and life-giving absolution as this one. So succinct, yet so powerful, this exchange between Nathan and David is also what takes place between you as sinner and your Pastor who is the Lord's man to forgive your sin. This is what absolution is all about: *the Lord has put away your sin; you shall not die!*"

This Lenten season, I encourage you to make use of the times available for Private Absolution. At Grace it will be offered on Wednesdays from 10:30-11:30am; at Trinity on Fridays from 4-5:30pm. Come and delight in surely not dying!
